**RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS;** a request for **County Bridge Funds** for the purpose of replacing a culvert, on T.R. 225 (2300 Ave) over a Tributary to Suck Creek, in Sefton Township, located approx. five (5) miles north of Brownstown, in accordance with Section 5-501, Chapter 121 of the Illinois Statutes has been filed; and

**WHEREAS;** the general assembly of the State of Illinois, amended Section 5-602 of the Road and Bridge Laws of Illinois, providing that any county for the purpose of administering Section 5-501, 5-502, 5-503 and 5-504 of this code and having less than 1,000,000 inhabitants may levy an additional annual tax not exceeding 0.05 percent of all the taxable property in such county, as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, which tax shall be in addition to all other county taxes and shall be in excess of any other rate limitation; and

**WHEREAS;** Sefton Township has petitioned the Fayette County Board for aid in replacing a culvert under Section 5-501 and 6-508, Chapter 121 of the Illinois Statutes as specified in the petition on file with the Fayette County Clerk; and


**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED;** that the County Board shall appropriate sufficient funds to pay one-half the expense, estimated to be \$8,000, to replace the requested culvert; and

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED;** that the funds necessary to furnish the county bridge aid required in the construction of the above described culvert shall be obtained from the **County Bridge Fund**.

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 2020-09-01-B**

**AN ORDINANCE REDUCING LIQUOR LICENSE FEE  
BY 25% FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-21**

**WHEREAS**, establishments within Fayette County with valid liquor licenses paid or will have paid their fee for a full year during FY 2020-21; and,

**WHEREAS**, COVID-19 restrictions in 2020 caused these establishments to be shuttered and reduced their business significantly; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Fayette County Board determined that the fair value of the liquor license was interrupted by the COVID-19 restrictions, therefore,

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Fayette County Board that all renewal liquor licenses for FY 2020-21 shall be reduced in cost by 25%. New or reclassified licenses shall pay the normal fees according to the fee list posted by the Fayette County Clerk.

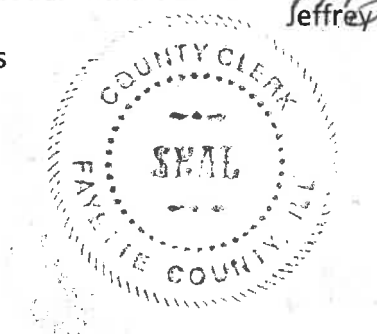

**Resolution Number 2020-09-01-C**  
**FOR PLANNED SPENDING FOR COVID MITIGATION**

WHEREAS, COVID mitigation efforts have added unplanned expenses to Fayette County operations; and

WHEREAS, Fayette County anticipates continued and additional expenses in continuation of protecting both employees and the public from unnecessary risk of COVID exposure; and

WHEREAS, Fayette County experienced extreme challenges in continuing public service and meeting statutory required services; and


WHEREAS, the Local Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency (Local CURE) program allows for reimbursement for appropriate expenses that would not otherwise be anticipated AND are not included in the current budget; and

WHEREAS, Fayette County has determined that expenses herein are warranted and would qualify for CURE reimbursement as currently defined.


Now, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and in keeping with sound fiscal policy and accounting, the Fayette County Board authorizes the use of reserve funds to meet the following expenses:

1. **Public / Employee Protection.** In that, the design of public service counters in the various County offices do not include protective shields and/or are in facility spaces that do not facilitate public distancing. Fayette County wishes to construct appropriate face shields and modify public accesses to allow for improved public spacing. The total anticipated cost to the county being \$35,000.
2. **Department Remote Capability.** In that, the restricted access to the courthouse severely limited the ability of departments to access information on secure (not personal) platforms. Fayette County wishes to procure county-owned laptop computer(s) for departments to allow remote operations. The total anticipated cost to the county being \$15,000.
3. **Virtual County Meeting Capability and OMA Compliance.** In that, the restricted access to the courthouse severely limited the ability of the County Board to meet and comply with the modified provisions of the Open Meetings Act. Fayette County wishes to procure technology and services to facilitate virtual meeting attendance by the public and potentially virtual attendance for board meetings. The total anticipated cost to the county being \$18,000.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING CORONER SALARY CHANGE

WHEREAS, Fayette County, Illinois (the "County"), has heretofore been duly organized and is now operating as a county under the provisions of the Illinois Counties Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Board sees fit to increase the Coroner salary to \$31,000; and

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Board sees fit to give a \$1,000 pay increase every year during term; and

WHEREAS, the salary increase of the elected official will receive a pay increase beginning December 1, 2020; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF FAYETTE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

SECTION 1. APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATIONS

The County hereby approves the salary change.

SECTION 2. AUTHORIZATION TO OFFICERS

The County Board Chairman is authorized, empowered and directed to execute any documents required to certify this schedule. The County Clerk is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to attest the signature of the County Board Chairman on such Contract. Upon passage and signing of this Ordinance and the Contract, the County Clerk shall file a certified copy of such executed documents.

SECTION 3. AUTHORIZATION TO OTHERS

All officers, Employees and Agents of the County are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all actions necessary, appropriate or convenient to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance and complete the execution of the Contract.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. REPEALER

All ordinances, resolutions, orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

## **ORDINANCE NO. 2020-09-01-E**

### **AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING CERTIFICATION OF LOCAL CURE PROGRAM SUBMISSIONS**

**WHEREAS**, the County of Fayette, (“COUNTY”) a body politic and corporate of the state of Illinois, 55 ILCS 5/5-100,1 is a non-home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, § 8 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

**WHEREAS**, COUNTY is eligible for reimbursement of funds through the Local Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Support Program (Local CURE Program), 20 ILCS 605/605-1045; and

**WHEREAS**, the Local CURE Program is funded from financial assistance the State of Illinois received through the U.S. Department of the Treasury’s Coronavirus Relief Fund (CFDA No. 21.019) authorized under section 601(a) of the Social Security Act, as added by section 5001 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act, P.L. 116-136 (“CARES Act”); and

**WHEREAS**, as a local government recipient of financial support through the Local CURE Program, the COUNTY is required to utilize the financial support received from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the specific purposes and in compliance with the terms and certifications of the Local CURE Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Board has determined that it is advisable, necessary, and in the best interest of the COUNTY to enter into the Local CURE Program Financial Support Conditions and Certification (“CERTIFICATION”), attached hereto as EXHIBIT, in order to participate in and receive the funding pursuant to the Local CURE Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF FAYETTE AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1. Recitals.** The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

**SECTION 2. Approval.** The CERTIFICATION, in substantially the form thereof that has been presented to and is now before the meeting of the County Board at which this Ordinance is adopted, is hereby authorized and approved.

**SECTION 3. Execution & Delivery.** For and on behalf of the COUNTY, the County Board Chairperson is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the CERTIFICATION in substantially the form of the EXHIBIT appended hereto, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized to attest to the same.



**SECTION 4. Conflicting Provisions.** All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of the conflict, expressly superseded on the effective date of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any provision of this Ordinance, is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance, or their application, that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision, or application of such provision, is severable, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
