

# **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP)**

## **Adult Redeploy Illinois (ARI) – Treatment Services**

**Fayette County Probation Department**

**State Fiscal Year 2027 (SFY27)**

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## **OVERVIEW**

The Fayette County Probation Department is seeking proposals from qualified individuals, agencies, or organizations to provide treatment and behavioral health services in support of the county's Adult Redeploy Illinois (ARI) program for State Fiscal Year 2027.

The ARI program serves moderate-to-high risk individuals involved in the criminal justice system who would otherwise be at risk of incarceration in the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC). Services are designed to address criminogenic needs, behavioral health concerns, substance use disorders, and barriers to successful community supervision.

The selected contractor will provide treatment, counseling, behavioral health intervention, and participant stabilization services designed to support treatment engagement, supervision compliance, relapse prevention, and long-term behavior change.

Funding for this contract is contingent upon the receipt of SFY27 Adult Redeploy Illinois funding through the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA). The anticipated grant period is July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027.

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## **BACKGROUND**

Fayette County's Adult Redeploy Illinois program utilizes evidence-based supervision, treatment engagement, behavioral health intervention, and multidisciplinary collaboration to reduce recidivism and provide alternatives to incarceration.

Treatment services serve as a core component of the ARI program and are structured to ensure participants receive interventions responsive to assessed risk and need. Participants receive ongoing treatment engagement, behavioral health support, supervision coordination, and service monitoring consistent with ARI program expectations.

The County is seeking qualified providers capable of delivering collaborative, on-site behavioral health services integrated within the ARI program structure.

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## **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

The selected contractor shall provide treatment and behavioral health services, which may include but are not limited to:

### **Treatment Provider**

Responsibilities may include:

- Delivering substance use treatment and behavioral health interventions
- Conducting screenings, assessments, and treatment planning activities
- Facilitating individual and/or group counseling services
- Supporting participant treatment engagement and retention
- Addressing criminogenic needs related to substance use and behavioral health
- Assisting participants with relapse prevention and stabilization
- Coordinating with probation staff and multidisciplinary team members regarding participant progress
- Supporting participant accountability and long-term behavior change

### **Case Manager / Coordinator**

Responsibilities may include:

- Coordinating participant services, referrals, and ongoing support activities
- Assisting participants with access to treatment, housing, transportation, employment, education, and community resources
- Monitoring participant engagement, attendance, and progress within the program
- Addressing barriers to compliance and stabilization in real time
- Supporting communication among probation staff, treatment providers, and multidisciplinary team members
- Assisting with participant follow-up, service continuity, and transition planning
- Supporting participant accountability, engagement, and successful community supervision outcomes
- Assisting with documentation, case coordination activities, and program-related communication

These services are intended to support participant stabilization, improve engagement in treatment and supervision, reduce barriers to compliance, and strengthen continuity of care throughout program participation.

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## **Clinical Director / Clinical Oversight Services**

The Clinical Director provides clinical oversight to ensure appropriate assessment, treatment planning, service alignment, and quality assurance activities within the program.

Responsibilities may include:

- Providing clinical guidance regarding participant behavioral health needs
- Supporting treatment planning and service coordination
- Ensuring services align with evidence-based practices
- Supporting program quality assurance and clinical oversight activities
- Collaborating with probation, case management, peer support, and treatment staff
- Assisting with behavioral health service integration within the ARI program
- Supporting development and sustainability of local treatment capacity and service infrastructure
- Assisting with implementation of treatment-related policies, procedures, and regulatory requirements
- Supporting participant stabilization, treatment engagement, and continuity of care

These services are intended to strengthen treatment quality, support evidence-based service delivery, improve participant outcomes, and assist with the development and sustainability of local behavioral health treatment services within Fayette County.

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## **Physician Support Services**

Responsibilities may include:

- Providing physician consultation related to participant medical, behavioral health, or medication-related needs
- Supporting coordination related to medication management and treatment stabilization
- Assisting with participant care coordination involving medical or behavioral health concerns
- Supporting treatment engagement and continuity of care for participants with complex medical or behavioral health needs
- Assisting with clinical consultation and coordination activities as needed within the ARI program structure

These services are intended to support participant stabilization, strengthen treatment engagement, and improve coordination of care for participants with medical, behavioral health, or medication-related needs impacting successful community supervision.

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# SERVICE EXPECTATIONS

The selected contractor will be expected to:

- Provide services in coordination with the ARI program structure
- Coordinate closely with probation staff and the multi-disciplinary team (MDT)
- Participate in case staffing and collaborative planning activities as requested
- Maintain appropriate documentation and confidentiality standards
- Deliver services consistent with evidence-based practices and ARI program expectations
- Support participant engagement, stabilization, and successful community supervision outcomes

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# MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants should demonstrate:

- Experience providing substance use treatment, counseling, behavioral health, or related services
- Experience working with justice-involved individuals preferred
- Knowledge of evidence-based practices, behavioral health interventions, and criminogenic risk factors
- Ability to work collaboratively within a multi-disciplinary environment
- Appropriate licensure, certification, or professional credentials as applicable
- Strong communication, documentation, and organizational skills

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# PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Proposals should include the following:

## **1. Cover Letter**

Brief overview of the applicant and interest in providing services.

## **2. Qualifications and Experience**

Description of organizational and/or staff experience relevant to the proposed services.

### **3. Proposed Services**

Description of how services would be delivered within the ARI program structure.

### **4. Staffing Information**

Resumes, licenses, certifications, or qualifications of proposed personnel.

### **5. References**

Provide at least two professional references related to similar services performed.

### **6. Proposed Cost**

Include proposed rates or costs associated with the proposed services.

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## **SUBMISSION INFORMATION**

Proposals must be submitted no later than **May 26, 2026**.
